Local Profiles: Mikačenić & Mataya

The Mikačenić sisters belong to the cadre of great Croatian Northwest Women Athletes whose feats CroatiaFest 2010 will put on show. It could be said that it was to be expected that they would become soccer standouts.



father, Mike Mikačenić sponsored 1st Division men's soccer teams named Croatia that won the National Amateur Cup in Chicago in 1982 and both the regional Amateur and Open Cup Championships in Denver in 1984.


Carmen and Nancy Mikačenić were stand out soccer players and led Lakeside High School to three state championships and four metro league championships while attending there. The Mikačenić metro-league standouts helped Lakeside women's soccer achieve a #11 national ranking in 1997. Carmen served as captain to the

1997 state championship team.



Nancy was a two time high school A11-American and Gatorade Pacific State and Regional Player of the Year in 1998 and 1999. She captained the

women's Under-17 national team and was a member of the United States Under-18 team. In 1999, as a starting member of Notre Dame's #2 national ranked team. Nancy was selected as one of the top 11 freshman in NCAA division I women's soccer. She was also selected the same year to the Big East League's All Rookie Team. Nancy competed in the finals in the national championship in 1999 and 2000.



After high school, Carmen continued her soc-Tuft's University. where she was starting member varsity for four vears. One of Carmen's goal winning headers, placed Tuft's

NCAA Tournament. As captain of that team, she led Tuft's through tournament play to compete in the National Championship finals.

Carmen's athletic prowess extended bevond soccer as stroke for the Lakeside High School Varsity Row-Eight ing that won regional's in



1997 and competed at the Junior Nationals in Ohio in the same year.

Frank Mataya from Roslyn, Cle Elum High School and Washington State University is considered to be the most versatile athlete that ever came out of the State of Washington. He was inducted into Wash-

ington State University's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989. He is the all time record holder for varsity athletic letters (12) earned at Washington State University

and Pacific Coast Conference Schools: 4 football, 4 track, 3 basketball and 1 in baseball.

cer career at He was a 3 sport stand out in high school from 1944 to 1946. As a tailback, he led Cle Elum High School to the Yakima Valley Conference Football Championship with to a win over Yakima High, one of the largest high schools in the state at that time. Cle Elum barely totaled 300 students in 4 grades. He was an all conference guard on the basketball team that went undefeated in conference play his junior and senior seasons.

> In track, Frank competed as a shot-putter. He won the state high school shotput championship with record throw of 52 feet, 7 ¼ inches at the state A meet in Pullman in 1946; a record that stood for 5 years. (At that time high school athletics were classified as only A or B category.) He accomplished that feat despite being only 5 foot 11 and weighing 175 pounds.

> From Cle Elum High School, Frank went to Washington State University where he was a starting varsity quarterback, basketball guard, shot-putter and played in the outfield on the baseball team. As was normal back then, he also played defense in football. He was known as a vicious tackling defensive back.

Seattle Tamburitza Music Celebrates Milestones

It seems hard to believe that it was 40 years ago when the late Tom Krmpotich began training 12 young musicians in the art of playing the tamburitza. Since 1970 over 400 musicians, singers and dancers have been a part of The Seattle Junior Tamburitzans, the region's longest running yet "youngest" ethnic folk group of its kind in the Pacific Northwest.

The group has been celebrating its 40th anniversary with year long series of events. In July 2009, the group took its 5th tour performing tour of Croatia visiting Zagreb performing at St. Joseph's Orphanage Hrvatski Leskovac and participating in the International Folklore Festival in Velika Gorica. The young Tamburitzans had performances in Punat on the Island of Krk, Cavtat, Vela Luka on the Island of Korcula and in Sali on the Island of Dugi Otok.

On February 13, over 350 former performers and parents gathered at John F. Kennedy High School for an all class reunion. The evening was filled with much reminiscing, sharing of stories, photo taking and hours of spirited kolo dancing to the music of the Sinovi Tamburitza Orchestra. The guests were welcomed by both current Artistic Director John Morovich and the group's co-founder Richard Major and were treated to a performance of songs and dances from the Podravina region by current members of the group. Starting chronologically, as the Sinovi played the popular "Kolo Seljančica", graduates were called out class by class starting with the first group of dancers in 1972 led by the group's first dance teacher, Gloria Kelemenić Barello. It wasn't long before nearly 300 dancers were kicking up their heels! The evening will remain a fond memory for all who attended.

This coming June 19, SJT will hold a 40th Anniversary KAVANA 2010. The youngsters are diligently polishing 4 choreographies from Podravina, the Islands of Susak and Dugi Otok and a brand new piece from Donji Desinec in the Jastrebarsko region near Zagreb. As a grand finale, all Tamburitzan alumni have been invited to join the current group in playing, singing and dancing which promises to be an exciting and fun conclusion to the performance. This SJT Historiette was originally prepared by SJT co-founder Richard Major on the occasion of the Tamburitzans 25th Anniversary in 1995 and subsequent historical details were added by John Morovich for this publication.

The Seattle Junior Tamburitzans were founded in September, 1970 on, on inspiration received at the Croatian Fraternal Union's 4th Annual Junior Tam-



buritza Festival held in Pueblo. Colorado previous July. The seed was sown when 11 Seattle youngsters and their parents tended the concurrent Festival and CFU Junior Convention, liked what they saw, and brought the idea home to Seattle.

From a rag-tag beginning, with antiquated instruments and generic folk costumes, the group progressed steadily—growing in number, buying new instruments and sharpening their musical repertoire. Wardrobe development proceeded more slowly.

Within months, the group began to appear publicly—Anacortes, Aberdeen, Roslyn, Tacoma, Nanaimo and Vancouver, B.C., Butte Montana, etc. The highlight of these early years was the group's appearance at Expo-74 in Spokane: the first World Fair to invite a Junior Tamburitza group. This was repeated in 1986 when the group was invited to perform at the 1986 World Fair in Vancouver, B.C.

In 1980 in order to participate in the 14th Annual Jr. Tamburitza Festival in Denver, The Seattle Juniors joined the CFU Jr. Cultural Federation. Sophistication soared as a result. Authentic costumes were imported from Europe, music stands were discarded and more boys participated in the dance suites—adding vigor called for by choreography. In 1981 the group conducted a whirlwind tour of old Yugoslavia that culminated with an outstanding performance at the CFU Festival held in Zagreb's Vatroslav Lisinski Hall. The group has since toured Croatia in 1986, 1997, 2004 and 2009.

The group participated in numerous festivals on this continent including Anaheim, Chicago (twice) Cleveland, Milwaukee, Seattle, Orlando, Pittsburgh (twice) Nashville and Toronto. A distinct honor was bestowed upon Director John Morovich when he was selected to be the Festival Guest Conductor in Chicago in 2005. In 2003 Richard Major was awarded The Aspasia Phoutrides Pulakis Memorial Award,

Vela Luka Croatian Dance Ensemble was created by a small group of Anacortes Croatians under the leadership of Maria Franulović Petrish, strictly for cultural preservation and presentation. The sisters, Maria, Alma and Binki realized in this country it does not take long to lose our ethnic and cultural identity and that work must be done to preserve and educate.

VL has now its fourth generation of descendants of one of its founders Jure (George) Franulović. He was an original dancer, teacher, and traditions educator. His daughters, Maria, Alma and Binki, followed his path - their children, Nicholas and Michael Petrish, Matthew Plancich and Maria Plancich Kesovija continued, and now Jure & Marija's great-grandchildren, Christopher & Jaimia Plancich and Ante & Katarina Petrish perform too, plus grandson Paval Franulovich Niemeyer! The sisters' first cousin Marija Damnajović Anderson continues

to dance today—she began in 1975; Maria Plancich Kesovija, today VL Artistic Director, and Michael Petrish, VL dance trainer, began as children in 1975; both Maria and Michael trained & danced with LADO Croatian Folklore Ensemble in Zagreb, Croatia. Our ensemble, Vela Luka, ensemble was, and is, a way to keep the family together—to see each other at weekly rehearsals and performances throughout the year and most certainly holidays!

The Vela Luka Croatian Dance Ensemble and Ruže Dalmatinke Orchestra perform music and dance of Croatia and the United States. The performers in Vela Luka represent four generations of Croatian-Americans who have introduced their culture's extraordinary choreography, music, and instruments to people all over the world. Forming a cross-cultural link between the Puget Sound region and Croatia, the company strives to preserve Croatian folkways and culture for generations to come.

The Ruže Dalmatinke Orchestra is a Seattle-based professional ensemble specializing in the music of Croatia and Bosnia, from the stringent open throat style of interior Croatia, to lyrical Dalmatian and Bosnian melodies. The group was founded by two sisters, Binki Franulović Spahi and Alma Franulović Plancich, who immigrated with their family to the United States after World War II from their native island of Korčula, Dalmatia in Croatia. The sisters are backed by expert musicians who are soloists in their own right.

BONACA: The talented men of Vela Luka/RD orchestra have formed the music ensemble - BONACA - performing folk and pop Croatian tunes.

Vela Luka and Ruže Dalmatinke have been featured in two national TV documentaries - Hrvati! (PBS, 1981) and Children of Ellis Island (ABC, 1986)-numerous local radio and television programs, as well as books and audio recordings. In 1986, they represented the State of Washington at the Rededication of the

Statue of Liberty in New York and at EXPO '86 in Vancouver, B.C. RD, in 1986, travelled to Mazatlan, Mexico, performing in numerous concerts. In 1988 and 1990, both groups toured Croatia and Bosnia-Hercegovina and in 2000, VL and RD traveled to the homeland once again performing throughout Croatia. They were featured performers at the Washington State Centennial Celebration in 1989; Voices West, Salt Lake City, 1991, 1993, and 1994, and the opening celebration of the Seattle Symphony's Benaroya Hall in 1998. In 1996, the ensemble received the Governor's Heritage Award from the Washington State

In 2004, amongst numerous local performances, VL performed at Paramount Theatre, Seattle, as part of the "DANCE this..." and the ensembles together performed for the opening of the McIntyre Hall, Mt. Vernon, WA. The 2005 calendar featured a tour to Oregon and inclusion in the Kirkland Performance Center Season. In 2008 VL performed the 10th Anniversary of DANCE this... at the Paramount Theatre, Seattle. Annual performances continued 2005-2009: Blessing of the Fleet, Gig Harbor; NW Folklife Festival; EHC Cultural Crossroads and EHC Winter Worldfest.
