AMERICAN ZAGREB JUNIOR TAMBURITZANS TO PERFORM

CroatiaFest 2026 is pleased to welcome the American Zagreb Junior Tamburitza Ensemble (AZJT) to this year's festival.

AZJT is a Croatian youth cultural ensemble based in Cleveland, Ohio. Founded in 1957 and celebrating its 69th anniversary in 2026, AZJT teaches traditional Croatian music, song, and kolo dance to young performers. Rooted in the earlier cultural group Slavulj, AZJT is a founding member of the Croatian Fraternal Union Junior Cultural Federation. Today, the ensemble includes 42 students, aged 5–19, under the direction of Music Director Gabriella Moissis and Choreographer Deborah Jennings Faraguna. AZJT remains dedicated to preserving and promoting Croatian heritage through music, dance, costume, and cultural education to foster future generations of American-Croatians. AZJT continues to perform throughout the United States, Canada, and Croatia.

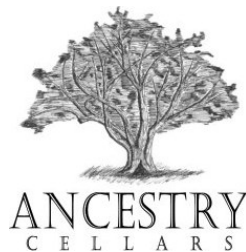

PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

New to our main stage this year will be the American Zagreb Jr. Tamburitzaans from Cleveland, OH. Returning to headline will be Rakija Bend from Chicago, IL.

Time Travel to Dalmatia will be exhibited in the gallery on the 3rd floor of the Armory accompanied by a lecture by author Brendan Weston. On loan from the Croatian Embassy in Washington, DC will be a display honoring the 250th Anniversary of American Independence with an exhibit titled "Croatian Americans in the U.S. Armed Forces: History, Service, and Partnership."

We welcome Attorney Don Markušić from Zagreb, Croatia who will give a lecture on acquiring Croatian land and citizenship. Also in the 3rd floor lecture room, there will be a presentation about the Domovina Birthright Program, a transformative cultural experience designed to connect the next generation with their Croatian roots.



Three new live demonstrations will be at the cooking stage, as well as new vendors located on the 3rd floor of the Armory just above the main stage.

Of course, we welcome back the performers, dance ensembles, exhibitors, food and merchant vendors, who have been with CroatiaFest for its 23 years.

Plan for a full day of fun, food and entertainment, exhibitions, lectures and fine wines, fun for the kids, and reuniting with friends and family at CroatiaFest 2026.

DOMOVINA BIRTHRIGHT PROGRAM

The Domovina Birthright Program is an unforgettable experience for young adults of Croatian descent between the ages of 18-30 who want to learn about their Croatian heritage, explore the beauty and excitement of Croatia, connect with their Croatian identity, and meet other young Croatian adults. It is a unique partnership between the people of Croatia through their government and the Association of Croatian American Professionals (ACAP). It is a 14-day cultural and educational immersion tour of Croatia organized by the Croatian government. Domovina's founders created this program to send young Croatian adults from all over the world to Croatia as a gift in order to strengthen the ties between Croatia and the Croatian diaspora. Participants travel throughout the country, exploring sites of historic, cultural, and religious significance, hiking, and taking in Croatia's immense beauty.

Boris Vilic will present an introduction to a documentary film and will close with a question-and-answer session immediately following the presentation in the 3rd floor lecture room Loft 1A of the Seattle Center Armory.

The Residence Inn Seattle Downtown/Lake Union is another great option - it is close to Seattle Center, across the street from Lake Union.

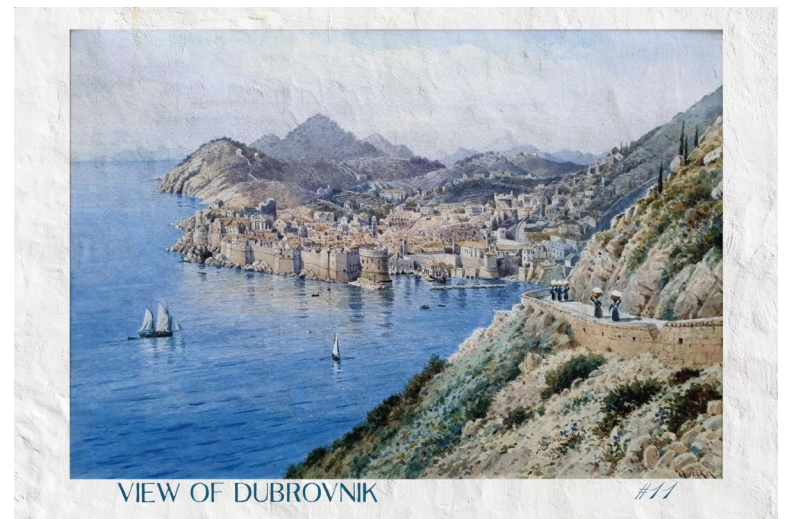

DALMATIA THEN & NOW

See the Croatia your great-grandparents knew.

Have you ever wished you could go to Split for a Carnival ball in 1849? March high above the river Cetina looking for eagles? Do you ever wonder what the people wore and what they ate and said?

Brendan’s *Time Traveler’s Guide to Dalmatia* takes you to Dalmatia at the peak of Austro-Hungarian rule when a simple walk down the Calle Larga showed all of history alive at once. Intimate experiences of travelers bring you back to Dalmatia’s bustling coast at the close of the 19th century, with pictures and maps and illustrations so you never feel lost on your voyage.



At CroatiaFest 2026, author and photographer Brendan Weston brings 19th-century Dalmatia back to life through a special exhibition and presentation inspired by his new book, *The Time Traveler’s Guide to Dalmatia*.

Travel back to the Dalmatia your ancestors knew through historic artwork, traditional nošnja (costumes), maps and illustrations of the era, displayed alongside Brendan’s contemporary photography of the same cities, landscapes and coastlines today.

During his presentation, Brendan will share some of the most fascinating discoveries from his research and the stories behind the artwork, photographs and travelers who helped document Dalmatia more than a century ago.

Time Traveler’s Guide to Dalmatia pieces together these intimate observations to reveal a place that feels at once remarkably different and surprisingly familiar.

Licitar are a cherished symbol of Croatian cultural heritage and are often given as gifts to express love, affection, friendship, or good wishes. Recognized by UNESCO as part of Croatia's traditional craftsmanship, licitar are commonly displayed during holidays, weddings, festivals, and other special occasions.

We have named this area "Chris' Kids Corner" in honor of Christine Jovanovich, who organized CroatiaFest's children's programming for many years. Christine was an alumna of the Seattle Junior Tamburitzans and had a deep, sincere love for children and a passion for sharing Croatian culture with the next generation.

DON MARKUŠIĆ AT CROATIAFEST

Over eleven years ago, Attorney Don Markušić joined us for his first CroatiaFest. In the middle of the night, from his home (which happens to have been built in 1744 and he has lovingly restored on St. Mark's Square, in Zagreb), he made himself available by Skype to take questions from the public at the festival. He has been a tremendous resource to CroatiaFest attendees for over a decade, and this year, we are excited to announce Don will be at CroatiaFest – in person!

Originally hailing from Australia, Don broke ground by becoming the first attorney with common law training to gain admission to practice in Croatia. He made his return to Croatia in 2007, driven by a desire to give back to the country. Don took that dedication to his homeland and founded the Association of Croatian American Professionals (ACAP), serves as President of the Asia-Pacific Chamber of Commerce, and has a resume filled with a lifetime of service, putting his background in law and business to greater good.

EXHIBIT FROM THE CROATIAN EMBASSY

“Croatian Americans in the U.S. Armed Forces: History, Service, and Partnership,” is an exhibition of historical panels honoring Croatian Americans who served in the U.S. armed forces from the Spanish-American War to the present. This exhibit is part of America’s 250th anniversary series organized by the Croatian Embassy in Washington, D.C.

The display contains multiple panels that tell the remarkable stories of Croatian American veterans from various periods of American conflict. From the Spanish-American War to Desert Storm and the Global War on Terror, each panel presents stories, historical information about battles and conflicts, and images of service medals, photographs, and artifacts related to Croatian American veterans. Among them are Medal of Honor recipients, high-ranking officers, and Croatian Americans who made the ultimate sacrifice serving the United States. A powerful reminder of the long and deep connection between Croatia and America.

CroatiaFest would like to thank Ambassador Pjer Šimunović and the Staff of the Croatian Embassy in Washington D.C. for bringing this historical exhibit to our festival.

The exhibit will be displayed on the 3rd floor of the Seattle Center Armory.

ALLIE WOODS TO DISPLAY

WATERCOLORS

Watercolor artist Allie Woods will be part of CroatiaFest this year. A homegrown Washingtonian, Allie’s connection to Croatian culture began through marriage; years ago, she fell in love with her husband, John, and the vibrant heritage his family carries from Žeževica, an inland village near the Makarska Riviera. The beauty of the land, the people, and the delicious food all make her feel at home when she visits. Allie has studied watercolor through classes and workshops, continually honing her craft through exploration and the joy of painting in her studio. Her style is realistic and often rich in detail, aiming to convey the joy and sense of narrative she feels while bringing shapes and colors to life. Allie’s watercolors have been featured at regional shows and community exhibits across the Puget Sound. Several of Allie’s favorite watercolors will be included this year in the third-floor gallery.

Mala Radost - Little Joys from the Heart: These hand-painted wooden ornaments celebrate love, heritage, and the beauty of a small joy – mala radost. Inspired by traditional Croatian folk art and Licitar hearts, each piece is hand-finished with a unique design, bringing a personal and meaningful touch to every ornament.

Adriatic Bloom&Sol brings a little piece of the Adriatic home through handcrafted lavender and sea-salt sachets inspired by the coast of Croatia. Made with Croatian coastal lavender, hand-harvested Adriatic sea salt, and, in select blends, Dalmatian herbs from Biokovo Mountain, each product celebrates the scents, ingredients, and natural beauty of the Adriatic. The founders, Nikki and Maggie, are two 13-year-old friends and first-time entrepreneurs with family roots along the Adriatic. Nikki was born in Split, while Maggie's family heritage reaches to neighboring Slovenia. Inspired by their shared connection to the region, they created Adriatic Bloom&Sol as a way to share a little of their heritage with others while learning what it takes to build a business of their own; from creating and packaging their products to pricing, marketing, and making their first sale. FOOD BOOTHS

This year there will be returning food vendors as well as new vendors with a variety of delicious Croatian-style foods available for purchase both inside and outside the Seattle Center Armory

Outside the Armory

Balkan Store will again have whole lamb roasted on the spit and grilled ćevapčići (Croatian-style links). Both meats will include bread rolls and condiments.

The Seattle Junior Tamburitizens will be offering grilled salmon with rolls and steamed kale and potatoes.

Inside the Armory

On the main floor of the Armory, Baked in Bosnia will again have traditional Croatian sarma (stuffed cabbage rolls). They will also be serving slices of their famous bee sting cake.

Balkan Support Team will again offer palačinke (Croatian crepes) and baklava. You can also purchase a cup of kava (Turkish coffee) to go along with these sweets.

OTHER BOOTHS AND DISPLAYS

Main Floor of the Armory

Talk with a representative from Adriatic Travel about travel opportunities to Croatia. The locally-built Batana boat, “Brač,” will be on display with its iconic red and white sail. The Seattle Junior Tamburitizens will host an information booth about their group.

Mezzanine Level, 3rd Floor

Walk up the stairs or take the elevator to the 3rd floor. At the entrance to the Art Gallery, stop by the “Kako Se Kaže” booth to learn about the Croatian language and compare dialects with Professor Nicholas Lovrich and Jasmina Cernak. Discover professional networking possibilities with members of the Association of Croatian American Professionals (ACAP). Talk with representatives of The Roslyn Cemetery Legacy Project. Both booths will be located on the balcony directly above the main stage. Bring the youngsters to “Chris’ Kids Corner” for fun with soccer-themed activities, creative art projects, and much more. The Kids Corner will be in a new location this year, adjacent to the elevator. Visit the Step and Repeat banner with props for the perfect photo souvenir.



There will be two Information Booths for your convenience to answer your questions – one on the main floor under the umbrella and the other on the 3rd floor at the entrance to the Art Gallery.

ON THE COOKING STAGE

Cookies, a holiday centerpiece, and after-dinner liqueur

The CroatiaFest cooking stage is expanding its horizons in 2026 and hosting three distinct demonstrations.

Chrissie Kristl and Julie Mustach will reveal the secret behind Croatia's famous checkerboard cookie. We all love them, but how are they made? They will demonstrate the process and hand out delicious samples at the end.

Many Croatian families grow a small dish of bright green wheat grass during the Christmas season. At this year's CroatiaFest, you'll have the opportunity to learn about this beautiful tradition firsthand! Sally Stefanich will give a live demonstration showing how to grow božićna pšenica (Christmas wheat). Best of all, she will provide free wheat berries so you can take everything you need home and start your own Christmas wheat.

Karen Zuvella will share a recipe from her "adopted cousin," Mara, a VRBO host in Dubrovnik who treats her guests to homemade limoncello made using lemons from her garden. The entire process takes about 10 days, so Karen will get a new batch started and provide samples of the finished product.

Note: Because limoncello contains alcohol, this demonstration is only open to participants who are over 21. Samples cost \$1 (state law prohibits us from giving away free samples).

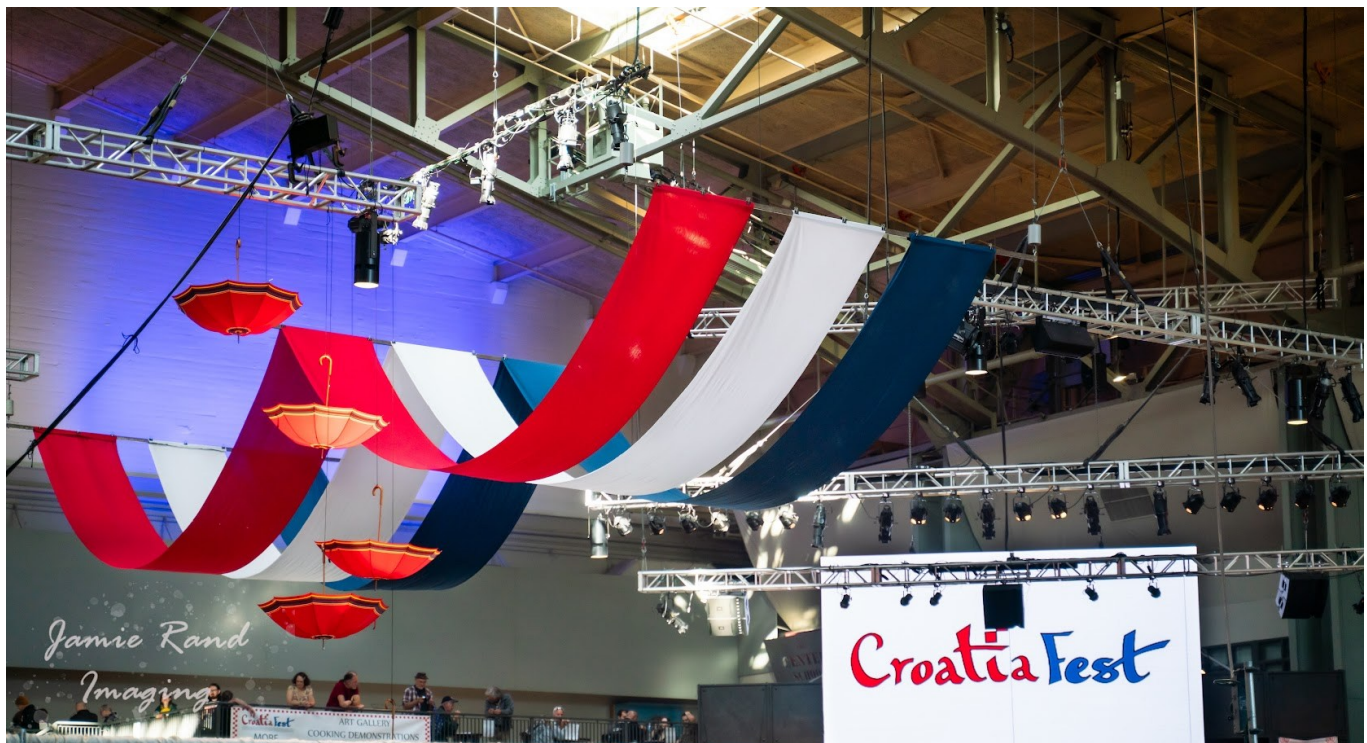

HOW TO GET TO CROATIAFEST

Are you tired of paying over \$5.00 per gallon for gasoline? Save your fuel dollars and let the Monorail, Metro Transit, Sound Transit, Light Rail, or rideshare companies like Uber and Lyft do the driving for you!

Explore light rail and bus routes from your neighborhood or a nearby Park & Ride. Check Metro-King County and Sound Transit Trip Planners to discover what's available. There are several bus routes that stop at the Seattle Center. If you take transit to Downtown Seattle, hop on the Monorail at Westlake Center Station, located at 400 Pine Street on the 3rd floor. You will arrive right into the Armory.

If you plan on driving to the Seattle Center, on-street parking is FREE on Sundays. Nearby parking garages include:

5th AVENUE N. GARAGE – 516 Harrison Street, Seattle, WA 98109. Entrances are on Harrison St. and Republican St., just east of 5th Ave. N.

MERCER STREET GARAGE – 650 3rd Ave N., Seattle, WA. 98109. Entrance is on 3rd Ave N between Mercer St. and Roy St.

THEATRE COMMONS ADA PARKING LOT – 2nd Ave N & Mercer Street, Seattle, WA 98109. Adjacent to the Bagley Wright Theatre. Entrance is on Mercer Street at 2nd Ave N.

There are several smaller parking lots around the area. Check out parking apps, such as SpotHero or ParkMobile, that can help find available lots and reserve your spot.

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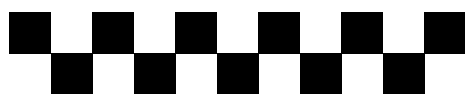
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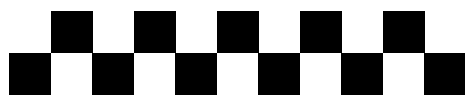
